

PRIVACY AND COOKIES POLICY

Processing of personal data

Information ex art. 13 Legislative Decree no. 196 dated 30/06/2003
(*CODE OF PROTECTION FOR PERSONAL DATA*)

In compliance with and to all effects of the aforementioned decree, **COMAGLIO S.R.L.** informs visitors to the site that data are collected and processed for the following purposes:

- Marketing, Newsletter;
- Sending of information / special offers also by Email;
- Tracking of online navigation and analysis of statistics for marketing purposes, using Google Analytics * (see references below)

We collect the following personal information:

- Your email address,
- Your name and surname

Processing is done both manually and with the aid of computerized systems that protect your privacy. Data may be stored both in paper form and in electronic archives. Your data may be processed by staff at **COMAGLIO S.R.L.**, or by third parties or companies appointed to carry out complementary, instrumental and/or auxiliary services concerning supplies or services provided by **COMAGLIO S.R.L.**.

You are not obliged to provide your personal data but a refusal would make it impossible for **COMAGLIO S.R.L.** to offer its services and supplies.

Personal data collected by **COMAGLIO S.R.L.** are communicated to the competent State Authorities only for tax purposes connected with company activities.

In compliance with and by effect of articles 7 and 8 of Legislative Decree no. 196/03, the Client is entitled to exercise all rights foreseen by this law, and that is:

- to obtain information regarding their personal data;
- to cancel, block, update, correct or integrate the data;
- to oppose processing of the data for legal reasons;
- to oppose use of data for commercial purposes, advertising or market research.

Personal data may not in any case be transferred to third parties for commercial purposes.

Cookies

Definition of “cookie”

A “cookie” is a text file that can be stored in a dedicated space on the hard disk of the user's device (for example: computer, tablet, Smartphone, etc.) when visiting the www.comaglio.it site by means of their own browser, and may require the user's consent. A cookie makes it possible to identify the device in which the cookie itself is stored for the whole period of its validity or registration. When visiting the website www.comaglio.it, information relative to navigation data received from the user's device could be stored in “cookies” installed on that device. The use of only technical Cookies (navigation, analytic and function cookies) does not require any consent. Settings relative to cookies can be modified at any time. More details are given below on how to do so.

Cookies allow visitors to navigate more easily from one page to another of the website and count the number of visitors in order to optimize navigation and related services.

Types of cookies used

The www.comaglio.it website uses only technical cookies during the visit and they are not memorized permanently on the user's computer since they disappear when the browser is switched off. Use is limited strictly to the transmission of session details (consisting of numbers casually generated by the server) necessary to allow safe and efficient exploration of the site and its applications.

The session cookies used on the www.comaglio.it website allow collection of the personal data identifying the user.

The www.comaglio.it site uses Google Analytics to analyze users' navigation to obtain statistics regarding the visits.

Google Analytics is a web analysis service offered by Google, Inc. ("Google"). Google Analytics, as all other systems, uses "cookies" which are text files deposited on the user's computer to allow the site to analyze the way visitors use the site. The information generated by the cookie on users' visits to the site (including the IP address) are transmitted to and deposited on the Google servers in the United States. Google uses this information to trace and examine use of the website, to compile reports on website activities and to supply other services relative to the use of Internet. Google may also pass this information to third parties when required legally or when the third parties process said information on Google's behalf. Google will not associate the user's IP address to any other data in its possession. The user may in any case refuse to use the cookies by selecting the appropriate setting on his own browser, but this could compromise use of all the web functions.

By using the www.comaglio.it site, the user consents to Google's processing his personal data for the reasons and purposes indicated above.

In any case, browser software for internet can be set in a way to refuse cookies by activating the so-called anonymous navigation function.

Cookies that integrate third party applications

COMAGLIO S.R.L. may include third party software on its site, allowing the user to share site contents with other users or to inform other users of the visit or to give an opinion on its contents. This is the case, especially, with the "Share" and "I Like" buttons on the social networks (Facebook, Twitter, etc.). The social networks provided with these buttons could use them to identify the user, even if the user does not click them when visiting the site. In fact, buttons like this could allow the social network to trace navigation on the site, simply because the user has logged in through his social network account on his own device (so-called open session). **COMAGLIO S.R.L.** has no control over the processes adopted by the social networks in collecting information relative to the user's visit to the site or other personal data. Users are requested to consult the social networks' policies for protection of personal data in order to understand the purpose of collecting data by means of such buttons, especially with regard to advertising. Social networks' policies must allow users to make their own personal choices in account settings.

Managing Cookies

There are various forms of cookie management. The settings chosen by the user could change the navigation experience and conditions for access to some services using cookies. It is possible to express or modify one's choice to use, or to refuse use of cookies at any time, as described below.

The browser can be configured to allow cookies to be memorized on one's own device, to refuse them automatically or to refuse only some. The browser can also be configured to visualize the request for acceptance or refusal of cookies before the cookie is installed.

(a) Acceptance of cookies

The user can decide whether or not to accept the installation of cookies on their own device. The user is free to make his choice and to modify it at any time through the settings of the browser installed on his device. If the browser is set to accept the installation of cookies on the user's device, the cookies used on the visited website will be temporarily memorized in a dedicated space on the user's device. They will be legible only by who installed the cookie.

In compliance with art. 122 paragraph 2 of L.D. 196/2003, consent to use of session cookies is expressed by the person in question by means of the individual setting made freely on the browser used to navigate the site. The user has the right to communicate at any time to the owner of processing his intentions with regard to the data managed by cookies as accepted on his own browser.

(b) Refusal of cookies

If the user refuses the installation of cookies on his own device, or in the case of cookies removed after being memorized, it will not be possible to use the functions necessary to navigate within some sections of the site. This is the case, for example, of some contents or services requiring log-in for access. Moreover, according to technical compatibility, it could be rendered impossible to recognize the type of browser used by the user on his own device, the default language, or the country where the terminal is connected. If the browser is set to refuse installation of cookies on the device, **COMAGLIO S.R.L.** cannot assume any responsibility for the diminished functions of services deriving from the lack of authorization for the storage and viewing of information necessary for the full performance of the site and connected services.

(c) How to make choices on your browser

Every browser offers different ways to manage cookies and relative settings. Configuration of the browser is described in the "Help" menu in the tool bar of most browsers, giving information on how to modify settings relative to cookies.
